DEAD WRONG

Commish tells union: Sgt. in slay of lady failed

THE NYPD'S TOP cop doubled down Friday on his immediate assessment that a sergeant failed to follow protocol when he fatally shot a mentally ill Bronx woman last week.

This time Police Commissioner James O'Neill said it during a meeting with the heads of the

"I did what I believed was right," O'Neill (below r.) told the union bosses at the breakfast meeting at 1 Police Plaza, according to sources.

About half of the hourlong meeting focused on the death of 66-year-old Deborah Danner and how the NYPD treats mentally ill people, according to sources who were at the meeting. O'Neill would not relent on his criticism of Sgt. Hugh Barry, who shot Danner — a schizophrenic woman

Danner discussion was led by Mullins (below l.), who last week called O'Neill a "neutered commissioner" who has "a lack of courage to stand up against a failing mayor."

"(Mullins) had his say and O'Neill seemed very receptive," one source at the breakfast said. "There were no raised voices and everyone had their say. It was

friendly and professional and everyone agreed to disagree."

Three hours after the sitdown, O'Neill shrugged off his ongoing disagreement with Mullins.

"He has to represent his membership and I have to look out for all the men and women of this police department. I also have to look out for the people of this great city," O'Neill said. "So we're not always going to be on the same page."
