Owners of Los Tacos No. 1 Embark on Maritime Odyssey With Opening of Los Mariscos

Chelsea Market is getting a new hub for fish tacos, ceviches, and raw bar items

The purveyors of some of the city's finest tacos and breakfast burritos are planning a new restaurant inside Chelsea Market specializing in fish tacos, seafood salads, and cocktails. Dubbed Los Mariscos, the new spinoff of Los Tacos No. 1 is slated to open this weekend near the original taqueria. Instead of simply adding seafood dishes to the menu at the first stand, co-owner Christian Pineda says he wants to keep the meat and fish carts separate, because that's how it's done in Tijuana, Ensenada, and other parts of Baja. In a statement about the opening, Pineda notes: "Authenticity has always been incredibly important to us — from our food to our décor — and by keeping Los Mariscos separate from Los Tacos No. 1, we're able to carry this authenticity through into a new concept."



In addition to fish and shrimp tacos, the menu will also include ceviches, cold mixed seafood salads, clams on the half shell, and oyster shooters. To drink, the restaurant will serve margaritas, micheladas, and palomas. The space will be decked out in white, blue, and yellow paint, and food will be available for dine-in or carry-out.

Later this year, the team will also open a standalone version of Los Tacos No. 1 in the former New York Times building at 229 West 43rd Street. Stay tuned for more details on Los Mariscos as they become available
